



PIG HILL WALK NOTES

(notes read anticlockwise from start)

0.0km [1] Start from Pilliga Pottery and head west past the workshop. You will pass a dam on the right and go through a set of double gates about 300m from the start. The next check point is about 100m past the gates.

0.4km

0.4km [2] Track junction, veer right and follow the 4wd track which runs roughly parallel with Dandry Creek on your right. About 500m from [2] the tracks turns to the left at a dam embankment (dam is on the right). About 50m further on a track leads off on the left to the sawn logs dump. Continue straight ahead to [3]

1.1km [3] Turn right to go over Pig Hill through some thick bush, Cypress Pine, Dodonea and wattle thickets to check point [4]. OR go straight ahead if you wish to take a short cut to check point [6] 0.3km

1.4km [4] A single gate, go through and follow the fence on your left for about 100m and turn left again and follow the fence to [5]. Along this section there are good views across Dandry Ck to a cliff line and a high point of about 500m asl. The cliff line area contains two more excellent loop walks (see separate walk brochure)
0.6km

2.0km [5] Double gates, go through and follow the 4wd track to check point [6] The thick bush on the other side of the fence on your right (south) is the Pilliga Nature Reserve. 0.3km

2.3km [6] Track junction, continue ahead for more good views of the sandstone cliffs on the other side of Dandry Ck. Go over a small stony rise and down to check point [2] 0.6km

2.9km [2] Track junction, retrace your tracks back to the start at Pilliga Pottery. 0.4km


3.3km [1] Start & finish, Pilliga Pottery.

FLORA - Trees - broad & narrow leaved ironbarks, brown bloodwoods, white box, river red gums, rough barked apples, white & black cypress pines, western scribbly gums. **Shrubs** - wattles, heaths, casuarinas, pea bushes, hop bushes, daisy bushes, hakeas.

FAUNA - Grey kangaroos, euros, emus, echidnas, wombats, eagles & hawks, rosellas, honeyeaters, ground parrots, wrens & finches to name a few.

CLIMATE - Rainfall varies widely from year to year but averages around 600mm. Summers are hot, mid to high 30's, Winters are cool, mid teens to low 20's (centigrade)

GEOLOGY - Mostly Pilliga Sandstone with lenses of conglomerate formed from large delta sediments during the Jurassic Period about 150million years ago.




